## Asian Studies Program Honors Thesis Prospectus

The prospectus must include the following elements:

- Title
- Thesis Statement: a question to be asked, a problem to be explored, or a thesis to be tested
- Literature Review: a discussion of what scholars or relevant experts have said and are saying about the topic
- Methodology: the methods or approaches to be used, and the materials or data to be used in research
- Importance of the Topic: What this thesis will accomplish and why it matters
- Preliminary Bibliography

The prospectus should be two to three pages in length, double-spaced, exclusive of preliminary bibliography. The thesis advisor and the second reader must sign below, signifying their approval of the prospectus. The prospectus and this signed form are due together to the Director of Asian Studies by 12:00 noon on the 1st of December.
